CHANGE, LOSS, COMPASSION & ART

"All change is loss, and loss must be mourned." -Harry Levinson (The McKinsey Quarterly, September 17, 2020)

This spring I've been thinking about change, loss, compassion and art. Let's not deny that our organization has faced immense change in the last three years. In art, we find a means of letting go and encouraging the 'softness' and 'pliability' that draw us toward the other; art propels us into a new place within ourselves where we find a degree of serenity." It is no surprise to artists that our feelings and our response to visual art reside in the same centers of our brains.

As we move into a new season at GVA, I suggest we reach out to each other knowing what a gift it is to belong. Compassionate creatives find new capacities in the human heart and mind. Ultimately, in Armstrong's opinion, they are more equipped to "live with the suffering that inevitably comes their way with serenity, kindness, and creativity." Wishing you peace.



Take-in dates and pick-up dates/times for gallery shows need to be adhered to. We cannot be responsible for work left behind past the pick-up date/time. If you need to make special arrangements, feel free to contact me. Our new location is often visited by curious walk-ins, so it behooves us all for GVA to "look marvelous" every day.

Lastly, if you want to donate art supplies, accessories, and/or furniture, please clear it with me first. The other Directors and I are in constant contact coordinating shows, classes, workshops, meetings, studio tours, and space rentals. We need to control the ebb and flow of what's going on and in our wonderful space. Also, please do not leave your art supplies behind after a session. Wet canvases can of course be placed on the drying racks. Dana announced on May 12 that if you leave "stuff" behind, you risk it being gone when you return. We don't mean to be mean, but consider this an official notice.

Your Executive Board, Directors, and Committee Chairs are all volunteers. We dedicate untold hours on behalf of this most incredible organization. None of us are looking for pats on the back. We are simply continuing what was first started in 1954 when Grand Valley Artists was founded (they later incorporated in 1957). GVA has provided a home for artists. A place to create. A place to learn and grow. A place to exhibit and a place to meet and mingle with other like-minded folks.

In 2021, GVA applied for, and was awarded, an Operational Support Grant from the Michigan Arts and Culture Council. This grant of \$10,450 may be used to help defray the costs of rent, programming, activities and studio use. Our responsibility is to give credit to the Michigan Arts and Culture Council and the National Endowment for the Arts and to show that we are an organization that actively helps realize the primary goal of MACC which is to "encourage, develop and facilitate an enriched environment of creative and cultural activity in Michigan. The Council envisions a Michigan where every citizen celebrates the state's cultural treasures and arts and cultural experiences are accessible to all its citizens."

Grant writing requires a collaboration between the grant writer, the treasurer and the editor to create the most persuasive argument for funding. This year Dana Donnell wrote the grant with the help of Julia Berry (Treasurer) and Mary Helmic (Editor and Proofreader). This dedicated team spent six weeks not only telling GVA's story, but giving reviewers links to all of the amazing achievements in 2021. We wanted to show off our AP High School Art Exhibit, our Black History Month Show, our Postcard Fundraiser, our Classes, Programs, and Workshops. The list goes on. If you want to feel proud of your art organization, just read this grant narrative. You all have good reason to say, "I belong to the best group of artists in Michigan!"

Once again, we have asked for substantial support to help us carry out new initiatives. These may include reaching out to arts organizations like the Grandville Avenue Arts and Humanities or the Heartside Ministry Arts Programs or invitations to Artists Creating Together and DisArt to help us become more informed about arts organizations serving artists with disabilities. There may be opportunities for us to form partnerships here as well. So in the coming months you will hear lots about inclusion and networking. We also applied for a Capital Improvement Grant to improve sound and lighting in the gallery and to add a push-button handicap entrance.

To put it simply, Grand Valley Artists is ready to let its light shine! We will be a stronger, more creative, more inclusive and more exciting community the more we embrace diversity, create connections and make new friends. Way to go GVA!

A TRIBUTE TO Jim Markle James Johnson

Jim Markle, long time member and past president of Grand Valley Artists, recently moved from Grand Rapids to Vermont. For me and for many others who knew him, Jim was the heart and soul of GVA for twenty-five years. In 1994, Jim retired from his career in advertising to pursue his passion for fine art painting. He became president of GVA in 1999 when our treasury was in dire straits. He developed the Reeds Lake Art Fair into a profitable revenue stream and GVA became financially stable for the first time since its inception in 1954 (GVA later incorporated in 1957).

Jim loved American Impressionism and seriously studied and soon mastered the principals of painting with a particular focus on pastels. It didn't take long for Jim to become a well-respected and collectable impressionistic painter in Michigan and far beyond. The Pastel Society of America included him as a signatory member in 2004. Jim conducted many workshops and was known for his warm, patient encouragement that enabled hundreds of artists to develop to their full potential. He led painting expeditions through the U.S., France, Italy, and Canada. For many years he exhibited with the West Michigan Eight, a group of elite Michigan artists which included Armand Merizon, Carl Forsland, Chris Overvoorde, Jack Brower, Jon McDonald, Colin Fry, and Larry Blovits.

Everyone who knew Jim will miss his gentle, calm demeanor; his sense of humor; and his generosity of spirit. Personally, I will miss having lunch with Jim every Tuesday, which we did for thirty-five years. Tuesdays will not be the same.

The Reason I Love Workshops

I have to confess I love taking art workshops. Through the years I've added to my art knowledge in whatever medium I was practicing by taking workshops. They've included workshops in pastel painting, printmaking, watercolor, and oil painting, but I've used them to experience plein air painting, still life painting, portrait painting, and computer workshops as well. One of the reasons I like taking workshops is that I always learn something new. I've discovered that each instructor, even those who are teaching a medium I'm familiar with, offers different and new approaches whether through their use of color or materials or how they handle their materials. And it's these tips that advance my knowledge and expertise.

I started taking pastel workshops at the old Grand Rapids Art Museum taught by Great Lakes Pastel members. But my first real workshop was a plein air workshop taught by Jim Markle at Fallasburg Park where I spent an entire day painting one tree. I kept the piece I produced because I get a good laugh when I look at it and how I managed to capture that one tree with the two shadows it cast, the one in the morning and as the sun moved into the afternoon, and I didn't. (See 1st photo.) One of my favorite workshops was a 10-day trip to France with Jim Markle sponsored by the Great American Pastel company.



In 2012, I moved back to southern California and decided to try printmaking. Fortunately, there were lots of classes/workshops within driving distance for me to try. One was held in San Pedro at an old military base called Angels Gate where the workshops were held in Quonset huts. It's there that I did my first silk screen and an etching workshop. I was hooked and decided I wanted to learn as many of the printmaking mediums as I could. I thought that meant going back to college and getting a master's degree in printmaking, but I discovered that was going to be very expensive so I tried the local city colleges and those were in my price range. I liked the range of classes taught at Pasadena City College, but it meant driving there in rush hour traffic at 7am in the morning. A local valley college stopped teaching printmaking, but I did find several classes at Santa Monica City College, a place I could drive to easily and at convenient hours. I signed up for beginning printmaking and for silkscreen. I also found The Armory Center for the Arts in Pasadena, a wonderful space that still holds lots of art classes in the evenings. I signed up for printmaking and letterpress classes and I was on my way.

One of my instructors at Santa Monica City College owns a small print studio in Santa Monica and it's where I continue go now to take workshops in reduction printing, whiteline printing, and mokuhanga, a Japanese form of printmaking using special inks and papers (moku meaning wood and hanga meaning print), as well as etching and monotype workshops. (See 2nd photo.)

When I moved back to Grand Rapids in 2013, I wanted to continue with printmaking workshops so I drove to the Kalamazoo Institute of Arts weekly. The Franciscan Center also offered a printmaking workshop with Lee Ann Frame, an instructor at the community college in Muskegon as well as an active member in the local arts community. I followed her to her workshops at the Holland Area Arts Council and at LowellArts.

And finally, after years of taking workshops, I felt comfortable enough to offer a few workshops teaching reduction printmaking at Grand Valley Artists. I discovered that I learn as much from teaching as I do from taking workshops by helping my students solve their own print problems. (See 3rd photo.)

So, as you can see I'm more than a big fan of taking workshops because through them I've advanced my knowledge in a medium that offers me many options to explore as well as one that helps to fill my need to be creative.





We are fortunate at Grand Valley Artists (GVA) to have so many of our members offer workshops. Kathleen Kalinowski's pastel workshops are always filled. Larry Blovits's oil painting, color and composition workshops and Ken Cadwallader's Still Life and Portrait workshops shouldn't be missed because you learn so much in them. Wes DeVries's Go with the Flow abstract workshops and lim Johnson's watercolor workshops are always fun. GVA also offers photography and learning to draw workshops among others. Terri Hanna, our new Director of Education, is doing a wonderful job with coming up with new workshops monthly. So, if you're hoping to learn a new art technique or try a new medium or even to improve on one you've been involved with, then I encourage you to sign up for a workshop or join me in Ken Cadwallader's Plein Air workshop this summer.
