

THINK TIDY PLEASE CLEAN UP AND KEEP CLEAN



The Grand Rapids Camera Club (GRCC) began meeting in GVA's fabulous new location in January 2022. GVA's facility is a great fit for our organization in size, location, and amenities, and we share a common passion for the visual arts. We have 70 members and we look forward to growing our relationship with GVA!

GRCC was officially organized in February 1899 and is one of the oldest camera clubs in the United States. From those very early days, the club held exhibitions around the area. We continue to display members' photographic prints periodically at libraries, coffee shops, galleries, and other venues around greater Grand Rapids.Club members' expertise ranges from budding photographers to locally and regionally recognized photographers who possess a wealth of information and willingly help aspiring photographers learn and grow.

We meet 10 months of the year (not meeting in July and August), on the third Wednesday of the month promptly at 7:15 p.m. Even during the pandemic we continued to gather using Zoom as a way to stay connected. Currently, we are back to F2F (face-to-face) meetings with masks required at this time, with a hybrid Zoom option. Our meetings include a program presented by gifted and talented photographers both locally and far flung (Zoom opened up the doors beyond Grand Rapids), followed by our monthly competition.

Club members are encouraged to participate in our monthly competition by submitting up to 4 images in each of our 2 divisions: digital and print. Images submitted can be in one of 7 categories. Three club members, who have reached a level of expertise and are trained in judging techniques, judge the images prior to the meeting. Scores are announced at the club meeting along with the slideshow. Once a year we hold a Year End Competition where images submitted for monthly competitions are judged by outside judges for Awards.

In addition, the club has an ongoing monthly Editing Challenge. This noncompetitive event encourages members to learn and share new digital darkroom techniques and ideas. The club also holds occasional workshops.

We welcome any GVA member to join us at one of our monthly club meetings. Be aware, there is a nominal guest fee of \$5 for non-members which helps defray our expenses. Program descriptions (and Zoom links) for the meetings are always on our website on our Events and News page. Also on this page is a link to our YouTube channel which includes links to recordings of previous programs.

Photography as Fine Art Submitted by Wayne Pierce



For decades, artists have discussed, argued and battled over over the question, "Is photography fine art?" As the profession and technology developed, so did the answer to this fundamental question.

Fine Art Photography is defined as images created in line with the vision of the photographer as artist, using photography as a medium for creative expression. The key to fine art photography is focused on the intent and creative ability of the photographer to capture feelings, thoughts, and attitudes by representing them through photographic images.

Historically, the earliest "fine art photography" dates back to 1851 with the creation of a daguerreotype by John Jabez Edwin Mayall titled *Lord's Prayer*. Slowly, over many decades, fine art photography joined painting, drawing, sculpture, and other aesthetic expressions of art worthy of attention and notoriety by top tier auction houses, museums, and foundations, including The Museum of Modern Art (MOMA), Sotheby's, and the Aperture Foundation.

At Grand Valley Artists, photography holds a strong position as a form of artistic expression. All the classifications of photography, including fine art photography, are represented by the photographers in our organization. Under the leadership of Randy Nyhof, photographers are supported and exhibited at GVA. Randy's tireless energy and dedication to his profession and to the GVA Photo Group assures members the opportunity to view and discuss each other's work and to exhibit annually in the GVA gallery. Those in attendance are fortunate enough to receive input and guidance from Randy and other photographers who willingly share their expertise.

So if you were wondering if photography is finally considered fine art, after so many years of debate and discussion at international, national, and local levels, the answer is definitely "YES!"
